



Honor Pin Award Overview

The Honor Pin recognizes an adult who has delivered outstanding service to two or more service unit areas or program delivery audiences.

- Criteria:** The candidate nominated for this award serves a broader area and has a larger impact on girls and the organization, than one nominated for the Appreciation Pin.
1. The candidate is a registered Girl Scout adult member.
 2. The candidate has provided outstanding service to two or more service unit areas or program delivery audiences in a way that furthers the council's overall mission and goals to serve all girls and increase diversity, membership, visibility and/or program participation.
 3. The candidate's service goes beyond the expectations for the position, which they hold.

Nomination: An individual or group familiar with the service performed submits a nomination form that documents the service and its scope and impact, and must include three endorsements from three individuals or groups (other than the nominator) who are familiar with the service performed by the candidate to the council's Recognitions Task Group.

Approval: The Recognitions Task Group reviews the nomination form and the endorsements and approves or denies the award. The Recognitions Task Group notifies the nominators of acceptance or denials, and notifies candidates of acceptance.

Examples of possible nominations:

- ❖ A person who organizes and provides leadership to a successful (area-wide - beyond one service unit) annual giving campaign that surpasses council financial goals.
- ❖ The volunteer director of a successful day camp that includes two or more areas.
- ❖ A volunteer program consultant who implements a series of events and activities that bring girls together from different parts of the council.
- ❖ A volunteer who directs a membership outreach task group that results in a significant increase in girl or adult membership in under-represented populations in several areas of the council.
- ❖ A volunteer council trainer whose events for an area of the council receive consistently high ratings resulting in increased participation by adults from several geographic areas.

Form of recognition: The Honor Pin is a green enamel pin with a gold tone trefoil design circled by a laurel wreath. It is worn on the right side of the uniform above the personalized identification pin.

Form to be used: Honor Pin nomination RE-0016-W.

Deadline: February 28th by 4:30 p.m.

Award presentation: At the Annual Meeting and Recognitions Event
